

טו בשבט / Tu BiShvat

Tu BiShvat or Tu B'Shevat or Tu B'Shvat (Hebrew: (עבשבט) vois a minor Jewish holiday, occurring on the 15th day of the Hebrew month of Shevat. It is also called "The New Year of the Trees" or (Hebrew: ראש השנה לאילנות, Rosh HaShanah La'llanot). Tu BiShvat is one of four "New Years" mentioned in the Mishnah.

Tu BiShvat Begins at Sundown on Sun, 24 January 2016.

Many Jewish people, particularly in Israel and on kibbutzim, plant trees or take part in activities to further environmental awareness. In this respect, Tu B'Shevat has a lot in common with <u>Arbor Day</u> celebrations around the world.

According to some readings of Jewish law, fruit that ripens in the first three years that a tree gives fruit is considered *orlah*. This means that it is not kosher and thus not acceptable for Jewish people to eat. Tu B'Shevat marks the "new year" or "birthday" of trees. Fruit that ripens in the third year on or after the 15th day of the month of *Shevat* is kosher. Traditionally, the fruit that ripened in the fourth year was taken to the temple as a tithe (form of taxation). This is now paid symbolically using coins.

Some Jewish people began to hold a symbolic *sedar* (meal) on Tu B'Shevat after 1600 CE. This consisted of different types of fruit and nuts, each of which had a specific spiritual meaning. This custom is still alive for some Jewish groups.

Tu B'Shevat is one of four Jewish New Years. One of the most well known is <u>Rosh Hashana</u> on the first day of the month of *Tishrei*. The New Year for kings and festivals is on the first day of the month of *Nisan* (or *Nissan*). The New Year for animal tithes is on the first day of the month of *Elul*.

Symbols for Tu B'Shvat: Barley.Dates.Figs.Grapes.Olives.Pomegranates.Wheat.

The seven species are associated with the Land of Israel in the Torah so they have an important place in Jewish culture.

Rabbi Mishkin's Message

"Treading Water in the Sea of Talmud"



One of the more unique pleasures of the Jewish tradition is the opportunity to participate in the study of Torah, and perhaps the most daunting subjects of study are the books of the Talmud. The Talmud has frequently been compared to a vast body of water such as an ocean because of the depth and breadth of its material. And yet, such study is possible today even for students without any background or knowledge of Hebrew/Aramaic if they use the appropriate sources and have the assistance of a tutor/

teacher.

In light of the success of our adult educational programs, I would like to invite you to study Talmud with me. I call this process of study "Treading Water in the sea of Talmud" because we will be using metaphorical lifejackets to assist us in our study. In this way, no prior background is necessary or expected. And yet, the rewards that come from this kind of authentic Jewish study cannot be underestimated. It is why Judaism has always been considered an intellectually rich and satisfying religious tradition.

If you are interested in learning, please give your name to Phyllis Greenberg. We will contact you in order to find a mutually convenient time and location for study based upon your availability. I will provide all the necessary materials and I envision these sessions to be weekly and approximately one hour in length. We will study regardless of whether we have two or twenty students. So take a chance and open yourself up to an exciting intellectual adventure. You will not be sorry.



HARVEY COHEN PRESENTED WITH SYDNEY LUSTGARTEN MENSCH AWARD



Harvey Cohen is Presented with 2nd Beth Ohr Men's Club Sydney Lustgarten Mensch Award

Sunday December 20, Harvey Cohen became the 2nd Sydney Lustgarten Mensch Honoree for his many contributions to Beth Ohr and the Beth Ohr Men's Club. His selfless and tireless activity has made him a cornerstone of the Men's Club. Last year the first Mensch award was presented to Sydney Lustgarten and the award was immediately renamed in Syd's honor. The award was made possible by a grant from the Lawrence Schacht Foundation through the efforts of Syd's close friend Professor Milton Heumann. The award was voted on by the Men's Club Board and results were not announced until the presentation was made. This was a big surprise to the modest Harvey.

Sydney Lustgarten

Syd Lustgarten was born on the Lower East Side of Manhattan. His family later moved to the Bronx where he lived until he was inducted into the Army during World War II.

He was initially tutored in Hebrew studies at home and then attended Cheder until his Bar Mitzvah. Syd graduated James Monroe High School at age sixteen.

In the midst of the Great Depression he went to work earning \$10 per week. He attended City College of New York at night and was drafted during his senior year and served four and a half years in the Army, rising to Technical Sergeant.

While in the Army, Syd was sent to finance school at Fort Benjamin Harrison and Wake Forest University. He eventually was stationed in Liberia, but also served in Nigeria, British West Africa, and Aden (now Saudi Arabia). In 1944 Syd was mentioned in *Yank, the Army Weekly*, about the American currency he disbursed in Liberia at the finance window when troops landed there at Roberts Field.

After the war, Syd continued his Federal service with the General Services Administration. He worked for GSA for over thirty years, becoming the Budget Director for a region that encompassed New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. He had budgetary control for all the Federal buildings in those areas including the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Presidential Library. Since then, Syd has become an FDR historian.

Syd has three children. Mitchell is a retired records manager who worked at the U.S. Attorney's Office in Manhattan. Marlena is the principal of the Hebrew School at the Farmington Valley Jewish Congregation in Connecticut. Alvin is a vice president in the television division of the Hearst Corporation in Manhattan,

Syd's family moved to New Milford, New Jersey in 1952. They joined a newly formed Conservative congregation where Syd served as Ritual Chairman for several years.

In 1983, Syd moved to Old Bridge and immediately joined Congregation Beth Ohr. He has been an active congregant, as was his late wife Lillian and he and Lillian attended services regularly. Syd has been a long-serving Men's Club Trustee and the Beth Ohr Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs Man of the Year. Lillian was active in Sisterhood and Hadassah. She served as president of the local chapter of ORT. Syd was a long time active participant in the daily Minyans at the South River Congregation.

Syd gave many well-received talks at Beth Ohr Men's Club. One was about *Hank Greenberg and his Times* on what would have been Hank Greenberg's 100th birthday. Others were on the *Jewish baseball-playing spy, Moe Berg; Frank Sinatra and his Love Affair with Jews; Jewish Composers of Tin Pan Alley-Irving Berlin; The Forgotten Generation: Growing Up in the Lower East Side During the Depression and Serving in World War II and Thereafter; and on the <i>Jewish WWII Major General Maurice Rose*. All of his presentations were well research, extremely informative and very interesting.

Syd was active in many activities, which included reading history, biographies, and other non-fiction. He also enjoyed listening to classical and popular music. He especially got kicks out of bluffing out his much younger poker-playing buddies. He also was a movie buff and originated columns in the Beth Ohr Newsletter on favorite movies and movie roles. Syd has also made the selections and introduced films at meetings of the Daytimers group who now named their movie programs in honor of Sydney. Syd also shared book reviews at the Sunday post-Minyan breakfasts.

Syd was very proud of his children, their spouses, and his grandchildren. Mitch is married to Arlene with Jason, Sara, and Josh. Marlena is married to Michael with Rebecca, who is married to Brandon, and Sarah. Alvin is married to Jodi, and his sons are Robert and Taylor.

Beth Ohr honored Sydney as its Man of the Year at a dinner dance held in September 2011.

Sydney was honored with the *First Men's Club Mensch of the Year Award* in 2014 at a program held on Pearl Harbor Day honoring the Beth Ohr veterans that served in the U.S. Armed Forces. The award was a surprise and was created through a grant from the Lawrence Schacht Foundation through the efforts of Syd's friend Professor Milton Heumann. 

Annie Hall is a 1977 American romantic comedy-drama film directed by Woody Allen.


