#### Rabbi Mishkin's Message

#### May 2016 – A Most Active April!



April was one of the busiest and most productive months for Congregation Beth Ohr due to three significant programs. On April 3<sup>rd</sup> our synagogue hosted a long-overdue return of our successful program, the annual Torathon. We featured twelve rabbis from the New Jersey community. They were affiliated with all four major rabbinic denominations and offered a variety of classes that ranged in themes from Jewish comedy to why the Conservative movement allows the use of kitniyot (legumes) for Passover. The synagogue was bustling

from 12:30-4:00 pm that afternoon with over one hundred participants coming from all parts of New Jersey and taking part in the important mitzvah of Torah study. It was a day of great pride for our congregation.

The following week, under the guidance of our ritual committee, members of our congregation with Federation youth gathered at the synagogue on Sunday April 10<sup>th</sup> at 2:30 pm. We participated in another important mitzvah; the burying of "Shemot," sacred texts and un-Kosher ritual objects with God's name that are buried in a sacred place rather than discarded. Leaving our congregation that afternoon, we drove to our cemetery where the books and objects were buried as we recited appropriate readings and prayers. It was a good day for our congregation.

Finally on April 17<sup>th</sup> our Sisterhood recognized one of its own, Ashna Pincus, as the Sisterhood's Torah Fund Honoree, at a luncheon with an overwhelming attendance. The many family members and friends who attended this affair obviously came to pay tribute to one of the kindest and most active members of both the Sisterhood and our congregation who has gone out of her way over the years to be a great ambassador of good-will for Beth Ohr. Again, our synagogue was busy on that Sunday.

I believe that these three events signal a resurgence of both interest and activity at our congregation. They are the result of hard work and great effort put forth by a number of volunteers who banded together to make certain that all three events were extremely successful. They deserve our gratitude and admiration. I am proud to say that Congregation Beth Ohr is doing wonderful things for Judaism and for our Jewish community!



#### Auschwitz – 6 | Years Later by Sylvia Kagan

I was born in a small village in Transylvania, Romania called Mikif in 1926. When I was 17 I was forced into a cattle car with my mother, sister-in-law and three young nieces, plus many others, and was taken to Auschwitz/Birkenau. Within minutes my family and I were separated and I never saw them again. I spent the next three months in hell - lack of food, no water at times, and 12 women sleeping on one level of a bunk bed. I was then selected for a work detail for nine months in Germany and the "accommodations" were not guite as horrible. In April 1945 the working camp was liquidated and we were once again put into cattle cars. Almost three weeks later our train was bombed and my right hand was injured. The wounded were left on a field overnight and then taken to a hospital where my hand was amputated. I remained in a DP (Displaced Persons) Camp for fourand-a-half years until I immigrated to America.

I wanted to go back to Poland for many years, but the time was never right. I thought if I don't go now to observe the 60th anniversary of the liberation, I never will. My age is against me; my walking will not get better. I tried to mentally prepare myself for Auschwitz saying that this time I am going because I want to and not because I am being forced into a cattle car. I will be there for a few hours and leave.

Tuesday morning, May 3rd we left JFK on EL AL, made a stop in Toronto, then flew to Krakow where we landed the next morning about 7:30 local time. There was a bus waiting for us and we started our tour. The group leader was Rabbi Michael Gisser of the Holocaust Museum and Study Center of Rockland County. We were referred to as the Rockland group and were given rust colored hats so we could identify our members.

Krakow was a very nice city which sometimes reminded me of Washington, D.C. We saw an old Jewish cemetery with beautiful headstones still standing and many others on the ground and overgrown with weeds. Next we went to the Galicia Jewish Museum which included pictures and displays of the Holocaust as well as other Judaica. I bought a CD of Yiddish songs and a very good cup of coffee – the only good coffee I had in Poland. VVe then saw the front wall of Schindler's factory, all that remains of the now famous building. I was extremely <u>impressed by</u> a shul – probably orthodox since it had balconies which we assumed were for women. The artwork of the balconies, as well as the lighting and high ceilings of the shul, was very striking. It was something to see. That night was spent in Katowice.

Thursday morning we left Katowice for Auschwitz to participate in the March of the Living and were given blue jackets with the March's insignia on the back. More and more buses converged and the crowd grew to between 18-20,000. The March then started on a wide street where there was no traffic – only blue jackets and blue and white Israeli flags for as far as your eyes could see. What a wonderful sight!

I was offered a ride on a bus when we were three kilometers from the site of the Yom Hashoah observance and I was happy to accept. In retrospect, I should have walked because just then security closed off all traffic leading to the ceremony in preparation for Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon's arrival. We waited for the bus for two hours and by the time we arrived at the ceremony, half the speakers were done and the yahrzeit candles were already lit. By the time the barriers were removed I had no chance to go to Birkenau and its Lager C - the one I was in 61 years ago. I very much regret these unforeseen circumstances.

#### Sylvia Kagan (continued)

The day in Auschwitz was bittersweet - it was difficult remembering the smells of the burning flesh and the flames from the crematorium. However, it was extremely powerful to know that I survived and chose to return. What came after in Chelmo, Lodz. Warsaw, Treblinka and Majdanek was far more stressful: I saw vast amounts of shoes, hair, bones, tools, and uniforms that the Jewish inmates were wearing when we arrived at the train platform in Auschwitz. There were ashes - tons of ashes - preserved in a huge monument so that the wind couldn't scatter them. I saw gas chambers and ovens and said Kaddish and placed lit yahrzeit candles in the ovens to remember the souls that had been gassed and whose bodies were later burned by the Nazis to hide the evidence. The bus ride on a Warsaw ghetto street gave me this eerie, twisting feeling in my stomach, knowing that on this street and others like it there were bodies lying around - sometimes for days - before they were picked up.

While in Warsaw we went to the umschlagplatz (the train station where the Germans gathered the Jews for transport). The railroad station I expected was long gone. In its place was a large marble monument of four walls without a roof. There were inscriptions in different languages on one wall. One corner of the wall was left open so we could go in and out and there was an additional small opening on the opposite wall so that we wouldn't feel trapped. Outside this opening was a tree signifying life in a place that had so much horror.

For the most part, the other people in the group were much younger than I. Some had their teenage children with them. Everyone had a different reason for being there. People called me "crazy" and a friend was actually hostile about my trip to Poland, but I had to go with my conscience. I did not make this trip lightly. I thought about it from every angle and the answer was always the same: I have to go. I knew this would be a difficult trip both physically and emotionally. The physical part turned out better than I expected thanks to a little cane/chair and the people in my group who were kind enough to carry it for me. The emotional part was more stressful at times and once again the strangers who became my friends were there to support me. I could not have picked a better group if I tried. The only regret I had was not going to Lager C.

As we were coming in for a landing at Newark Airport one woman said, "I'm stopping off at my mother's first." Her friend asked, "Why? It will be late." The first woman responded, "I need to give her a hug and a kiss."

A statement like this on the way home from Poland speaks volumes.
