Rosh Hashanah Thoughts by Rabbi Joel S Mishkin:

I have recently noticed a new phenomenon that has emerged in our day. It initially surprised me, but after several months of observation I am convinced that silence, introspection and reflection are rapidly becoming rare commodities in our lives. I made that observation in, of all places, the public library. Often I will go there to read, think and write in preparation for Sabbath services, but increasingly I have discovered that it is becoming more and more difficult to secure a quiet place, even in a library. Now I realize that libraries provide many functions, some of which require discussion, conversation and other activities, but more frequently than not it is impossible to find a serene place for thought even in the one place intended for such use. Whether it is the clack of the mah jongg pieces, the constant buzzing of the cell phones, even the not-so-low voices in conversation, the fact of the matter is that these noisome interruptions have a disruptive effect.

One of the great advantages of the synagogue is that it has been traditionally known as a place for deep thought, communal singing and reflective prayer. On the other hand, one of the great disadvantages of the synagogue is that at its most popular moments, these opportunities can be compromised. It is wonderful to be able to greet friends on the occasion of a New Year and see people we may have not greeted in several months. However we should never let social considerations overwhelm our fellow congregants' desire to pray, sing and listen carefully to the proceedings during service. While the world outside our sanctuary becomes ever busier, noisier and more disruptive, let us seek the serenity that distinguishes this time of year and our lovely and comfortable sanctuary.

As always, I welcome our members and guests and look forward to wishing you a Shanah Tovah. Furthermore I invite those who have yet to find a spiritual home to come and spend the holidays with us at Congregation Beth Ohr. If you are looking for both a serene and haimish place, you will most certainly find that here. I offer my most profound hope that we experience a New Year filled with peace, serenity and comfort and that this New Year will be a blessing

The actual date that the Yahrzeit is observed is to the right of the name. It is customary to light a memorial candle on the eve of this date and to give tzedakah in memory of the Yahrzeit. One should recite the Mourner's Kaddish at services the evening before as well as the day of the Yahrzeit. The name of your departed will be read at the Friday evening and Shabbat morning services the week before the Yahrzeit date which are represented by the dates in the columns which are in bold print.

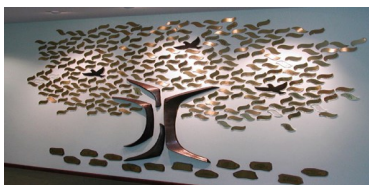

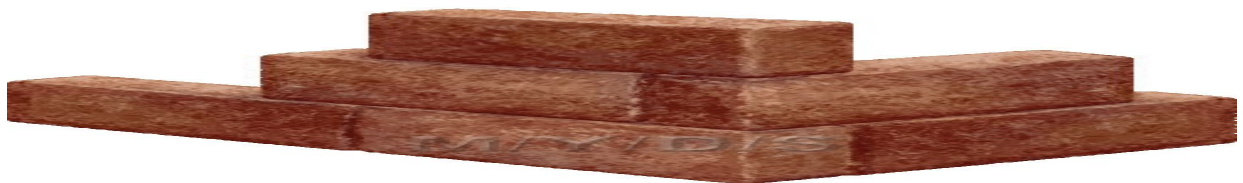

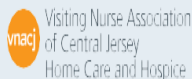
