

Beha'alosecha

Numbers 8:1-12:16

Parsha name


Baha'alosecha: when you kindle [the lamps]. Introduction to the menorah.

Torah portion summary and selections

Portion tells about the menorah, the next step by Hashem; dedication of the Levites; the first Passover; the second Passover (in the second month for those unable to observe Passover at the appointed time); the fiery cloud; and Jethro reappears??? and then leaves!!! [Didn't he leave in Exodus 18?]. The theme of the movie "Raiders of the Lost Ark": *Vayehe binso ahharon*, when the ark set forward Moses said "Rise up, O L-rd and let Thine enemies be scattered!" (Num. 10:35). And then a lot of kvetching, and more kvetching and even more kvetching. Very disconcerting to Moses. Even Miriam and Aaron kvetched. Read the entire parsha to find out how G-d satisfied the kvetching about the lack of meat; and how Miriam was punished for her "lashon hora" (evil speech) about Moses' wife Zipporah.

Speak unto Aaron, and say unto him: When thou lightest the lamps, the seven lamps shall give light in front of the candlestick.

Numbers 8:2



1. Aaron was perturbed when he was not asked to participate in the offerings for the Temple along with the princes; so G-d gave him the menorah to light.

2. The menorah indicates multiple significance. Aaron's life was considered by G-d to be a light to everyone because he brought them closer to Torah. Also, the lights of the menorah are a symbol of the soul of man. The seven lamps signify the seven kinds of Jewish soul. Aaron is to light the menorah until the flames raise up (behaalosecha) by itself - the flames being the light of each person's self-sustained love of G-d.

3. The menorah is used here as a symbol of Judaism. The six-pointed Star of David is considered nowadays as that symbol, but that is a recent occurrence. At the very end of the nineteenth century, Theodore Herzl adopted the star as the symbol of Zionism. The Nazis in the 1930s made Jews wear the star as an identification mark. And in 1948 the new State of Israel used the star on their flag fully adopting it as an indelible emblem of Judaism. Note, that some people believe that the Jewish star was placed on the seal of the United States as a "reward" for the help of Hyam Solomon during the American Revolution. I could not find any historic facts to substantiate this. The star formation in the seal (look on the back of the \$1 bill) is composed of 13 stars which correspond to the 13 original colonies and symbology of the number 13 which also appears in many other ways on the seal such as the 13 rows above the base of the pyramids, the 13 letters in the motto *E Pluribus Unum* and the inscription *Annuit Coeptis*, the 13 leaves and berries in the right hand of the eagle, and 13 arrows in the left. If anyone can show me otherwise regarding the "Jewish Star", I would appreciate hearing from you.

And it came to pass in the second year, in the second month, on the twentieth day of the month, that the cloud was taken up from over the tabernacle of the testimony.

Numbers 10:11

The journey continues. "The cloud" signified the Divine Presence that appeared at Mount Sinai. This shows that Gd continued to love the Children of Israel as He did at Mount Sinai. The testimony is the tablets of the Ten Commandments and the tabernacle that housed them. Also, the cloud would guide them during their journey spiritually as well as physically. Little did anyone realize that this journey would take more than 38 years.
